How to enter:

Bring in your entries with the entry form(s) to the fairgrounds on **Monday, August 16 or Tuesday, August 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.** Entries will be taken in the South Expo Building. If you want to enter early and reduce time spent in line on entry days you have the following 2 options:

1. a. Mail or deliver **ONLY** your **entry form(s)** to the Premium Office, 5610 Glenwood, Boise ID 83714 by **August 9.**
- b. Bring your **entries** to the fairgrounds on August 16 or August 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- or 2. a. Enter online by **August 9** at www.idahofair.com. Follow the link to Competitive Exhibits.
 A \$2 fee will apply. This fee is per exhibitor, regardless of number of entries or in how many departments you enter.
- b. Bring your **entries** to the fairgrounds on August 16 or August 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

PLEASE NOTE: See Department 19 for all Youth entries, age 17 & younger. Youth are welcome to enter Department 15 if they wish to compete with adults.

1. **ENTRIES:** Entries will be received in the **SOUTH WING** of the Exposition Building. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Each exhibitor may enter only **ONE ARTICLE IN EACH CLASS.** No item can be entered for competition for more than one year. The individual or his authorized agent must enter projects. Any person, not an employee or officer of the Western Idaho Fair, is eligible to act as an agent. No articles sent by parcel post or express will be accepted. **"Professional" in this department refers to any person who has sold, taught, or is currently teaching their craft for any monetary gain.** An entry fee of **\$3.00** will be charged for each project entered in the Professional Division only. **"Amateur"** in this department refers to those **who do not sell their projects for any purpose or monetary gain.** There will be no entry fee charged in the Amateur Division.
2. **JUDGING:** Wednesday, Aug. 18-8:00 a.m. Department will be closed during judging. Where there is no competition, entry will be awarded first, second, third, or no premium, according to the merits of the article.

3. **PREMIUM PAY-OUT: AWARDS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THE PREMIUM OFFICE. COPY OF EXHIBITOR ENTRY FORM SHOULD BE PRESENTED FOR PREMIUM PAY-OUT.** Cash premiums will be paid to those entitled to awards on Aug. 24 through Aug. 29 from 12 Noon to 8:00 p.m. and on Exhibit Release day, Monday, Aug. 30 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Starting Aug. 30 through Sept. 9, awards will be given out from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. The Office will be closed for Labor Day weekend. **Awards not claimed by Sept. 9, 2010** will be considered a donation and will revert back to the Western Idaho Fair general fund.
4. **RELEASE:** Monday, Aug. 30-10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. **IN NO CASE MAY EXHIBITS BE REMOVED BEFORE 10:00 A.M. MONDAY, AUG. 30.** Exhibits which are not claimed within one week after the close of the Fair will be considered to have been abandoned and will be disposed of as the Manager of the Fair sees fit. **Exhibitors must present claim checks** corresponding with entry tags when claiming exhibits. Exhibits must not be removed without the Superintendent or assistants being present to check out entries.

5. **ADDITIONAL RULES:** Exhibitors are requested to read the General Rules of this Fair. Department Rules supersede General Rules.

All work entered in this department must have been completed in the last year. All articles entered shall be under the control of the Superintendent of this department. Exhibitors wishing to sell projects may so notify the Superintendent. Prices of articles **CANNOT** appear on the project to be sold. In case of a sale of a project, the Superintendent or the management of the Western Idaho Fair will not be held responsible for the collection of money or delivery of the project. Every precaution will be taken to insure the safety of the exhibits, but the exhibitor assumes all responsibility in case of loss or theft and **in no case will the management of the Western Idaho Fair or the Superintendent be responsible for loss or injury of same.** An exhibitor who has once competed as a professional in the desired division may not reclassify himself as an amateur and enter the competition again in that same division.

6. We recommend that hot glue not be used on entries. Hot glue relaxes at 80 degrees.
7. **No Power** will be provided for exhibits. **No Water** will be allowed. Exhibits (i.e. fountains, etc.) must remain dry.

SPECIAL AWARDS

KITCHEN CRAFT will award \$100 to the winner of the **Superintendent's Choice** overall Hobby Craft entries, and \$50 to the winner of the **Superintendents Award** in both the Professional and Amateur categories.

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a plaque for the Hobby Craft exhibit that best portrays the **FAIR THEME "BARNYARD BALL"**.

The **WESTERN IDAHO FAIR** will award \$25 to the **"Judges Selection"** of a favorite non-blue ribbon project in both the Professional and Amateur Divisions.
