PLEASE NOTE: No professional fees are charged in this department. Therefore, individuals who earn 20% or more of their income from any skill featured in this department may not enter as amateur exhibitors. Home Arts exhibitors must be 18 years or older. Exhibitors who want to be eligible for the eldest Senior Award must provide birth date and age when entering on line.

How to enter:

Bring in your entries with the entry form(s) to the fairgrounds on **Monday, August 16 or Tuesday, August 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.** Entries will be taken in the South Expo Building. If you want to enter early and reduce time spent in line on entry days you have the following 2 options:

1. a. Mail or deliver **ONLY** your **entry form(s)** to the Premium Office, 5610 Glenwood, Boise ID 83714 by **August 9.**
 - b. Bring your **entries** to the fairgrounds on August 16 or August 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

2. a. Enter online by **August 9** at www.idahofair.com. Follow the link to Competitive Exhibits.
A \$2 fee will apply. This fee is per exhibitor, regardless of number of entries or in how many departments you enter.
 - b. Bring your **entries** to the fairgrounds on August 16 or August 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

1. Entries will be received in the **SOUTH WING** of the Exposition Building. **Entries must be made on forms supplied by Western Idaho Fair. Multiple forms may be used, but each Exhibitor needs only One Exhibitor Number for all entries in all departments. Entry forms must be presented with items at time of entry.**

All items must be the handwork of the exhibitor, clean and completed within the last 12 months. Articles exhibited at the Western Idaho Fair in previous years will not be eligible for competition. If, in the opinion of Department 17, an article has previously been entered, exhibitor enters more than one item in a class, or falsely claims handwork done by others, the right is reserved to withhold the item from judging. If item or type of work is listed in the numbered classes, the same type of work may **NOT** be entered in “any item of merit not listed” class. The Superintendent shall disqualify, or transfer to the correct class, any exhibit which is not a true representation of the class in which it is entered. Only **ONE** item in a class will be accepted from any one person. **No entry fee** is charged in this Department.

RESTRICTIONS: Pertaining to all pictures regardless of class entered: No pairs or units (except where specified); Work must be covered on the back; Framed; Ready for hanging with a wire attached to **SCREW EYES**; May be under glass; Must not exceed (24" X 30") 720 square inches including frame.

RESTRICTIONS: Pertaining to all Quilted Wall Hangings - See Division 8.

RESTRICTIONS: Beginners for all Divisions and Classes means the exhibitor has six months or less experience in any needlework.

2. **JUDGING: JUDGES SCORE CARDS** have assigned values for Appearance, Presentation, Design, Craftsmanship, Creativity, etc. Judging is Wednesday, Aug. 18-**8:00 a.m.** This area will be closed during judging. Judges will award premiums only when articles are deemed worthy of merit. If no competition exists and an article is not worthy of a first premium, Judges may award a second or no premium. **Judges decisions are final.** Premiums will be awarded only on classes listed.
3. **PREMIUM PAY-OUT: AWARDS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THE PREMIUM OFFICE. COPY OF EXHIBITOR'S NUMBER FORM SHOULD BE PRESENTED FOR PREMIUM PAY-OUT.** Cash premiums will be paid to those entitled to awards on Aug. 24 through Aug. 29 from 12 Noon to 8:00 p.m. and on Exhibit Release day, Monday, Aug. 30 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Starting Aug 31 through Sept. 9, awards will be given out from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. The Office will be closed for Labor Day weekend. **Awards not claimed by Sept. 9, 2010** will be considered a donation and will revert back to the Western Idaho Fair general fund.
4. **RELEASE:** Monday, Aug. 30-10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. **IN NO CASE MAY EXHIBITS BE REMOVED BEFORE 10:00 A.M. MONDAY, AUG. 30.** Exhibits which are not claimed within one week after the close of the Fair will be considered to have been abandoned and will be disposed of as the fair manager sees fit. **Exhibitors must present claim checks** corresponding with entry tags when claiming exhibits. Exhibits must not be removed without the Superintendent or assistants being present to check out entries.
5. **ADDITIONAL RULES:** Exhibitors should read the General Rules & Regulations in the front of this book. Department Rules supersede General Rules. All exhibits will be under the

control and direction of the Superintendent. Every precaution will be taken to insure the safety of the exhibits, but the exhibitor assumes all responsibility in case of loss or theft and **in no case will the management of the Western Idaho Fair or the Superintendent be responsible for loss or damage to same.** Exhibitors wishing to sell items may notify the Superintendent. **Prices of items CANNOT** appear on the item to be sold. In case of a sale of an item, the Superintendent or the management of the Western Idaho Fair **will not be responsible for the collection of money or delivery of exhibit.**

SPECIAL AWARDS

AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a certificate & rosette to the exhibit that shows innovative techniques, creativity and/or superb workmanship.

KITCHEN CRAFT will award \$20 to the winner of the “Award of Excellence”.

FAIR THEME AWARD

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a plaque for the exhibit that best portrays this year's Fair Theme, “**BARNYARD BALL**”.

KITCHEN CRAFT will award \$20 to the winner of the “Fair Theme Award”.

SWEEPSTAKES AWARDS

GRAND SWEEPSTAKES AWARD

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a **GRAND SWEEPSTAKES PLAQUE** and rosette to the person who accumulates the **most points from all classes combined.** To be eligible you must **enter at least one item in a minimum of five different divisions. Award will be based on total points earned:** (First=4 points, Second= 2 points, Third=1 point) The number of points in each class to be multiplied by the number of entries in that class. All blue ribbon entries awarded the “Best of Division” will be awarded ten additional points to be added to the final accumulated score toward Grand Sweepstakes.

KITCHEN CRAFT will award \$50 to the winner of the “Grand Sweepstakes Award”.

NEEDLE ARTS AWARD

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a **SWEEPSTAKES PLAQUE** to the exhibitor with the most accumulated points in Divisions 1 thru 6 and 11 thru 14. **Award will be based on total points earned;** (First=4 points, Second= 2 points, Third=1 point) The number of points in each class to be multiplied by the number of entries in that class.

KITCHEN CRAFT will award \$20 to the winner of the “Needle Arts Award”.

CLOTHING AND TEXTILES AWARD

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a **SWEEPSTAKES PLAQUE** to the exhibitor with the most points in Divisions 7 thru 10 and Div. 15. **Award will be based on total points earned;** (First=4 points, Second= 2 points, Third=1 point) The number of points in each class to be multiplied by the number of entries in that class. Must be quilted or home sewn.

KITCHEN CRAFT will award \$20 to the winner of the “Clothing and Textiles Award”.

SENIOR GRAND SWEEPSTAKES AWARD

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a **SWEEPSTAKES PLAQUE** to the exhibitor in the Senior Division who accumulates the most points. **Award will be based on total points earned;** (First=4 points, Second= 2 points, Third=1 point) The number of

points in each class to be multiplied by the number of entries in that class.

KITCHEN CRAFT will award \$20 to the winner of the “**Senior Grand Sweepstakes Award**”.

HOME ARTS SUPERINTENDENT AWARD

KITCHEN CRAFT will present a \$10 cash award to five “**Blue Ribbon**” recipients. This award is open to all first place winners within the department. Good luck in the “**Blue Ribbon Drawing**.”

HOME ARTS DEPARTMENT KNITTING AWARD

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a Certificate of Merit and \$5.00 premium in Divisions 2 and 11 and Divisions 18/2 and 18/11 for each of the following three categories: “Best Use of Color”, “Best Use of Texture”, and “Best Knitted Lace.” Winning projects must be done by an individual.

HOME ARTS DEPARTMENT QUILTING AWARD

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will present a \$25.00 cash award and quilt batt to the “**Best of Division**” winner for Quilting. In addition, the Western Idaho Fair will award a quilt batt to the first place winner in five quilt categories. All full-size quilts in Division 7, Classes 155-157; 161-168; 180-188 and in Division 18/7, Classes 495-498 ; 500-504 are eligible for this award. This project must be done by an individual.

BEST OF DIVISION AWARD

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a \$5 cash award and rosette to the “**BEST OF DIVISION**” in each division where items are deemed worthy of merit. Division 1-17, 18/1-18/15, and 19.

HOME ARTS QUILTED WALL HANGING AWARD

Six “Best of Division” recipients in Division 8 will be awarded a small size batt. This project must be done by an individual and all Home Arts restrictions apply.

THE BOISE BASIN QUILTERS, INC. will present a \$75 cash award for each of the following two categories: “**Best of Show**” - **Traditional Quilt** and “**Best of Show**” - **Contemporary Quilt**. These awards are open to all entries in Divisions 7, 8, 18/7 & 18/8. All work on the entry must be done by the exhibitor. Winning projects will be chosen by the Boise Basin Quilters, Inc.

THE WESTERN IDAHO CHAPTER OF EMBROIDERER'S GUILD OF AMERICA will present three \$25 cash awards for excellence of technique. These awards are open to all entries in Divisions 4, 5, 6, 18/4, 18/5 & 18/6. Winning projects will be chosen by the Western Idaho Chapter of Embroiderer’s Guild of America.

THE AMERICAN NEEDLEPOINT GUILD will present the following: First Place – a Stitch Related Item; Second Place – a Certificate of Merit; Third Place – a Certificate of Merit. These awards will be chosen and presented by American Needlepoint Guild representatives.

C. IRIS ON POND AWARD – C. Iris on Pond, Boise will award \$25.00 to the first place winner; \$15.00 to the second place winner, and \$10.00 to the third place winner for the “best use of an Iris flower image” in any exhibit submitted to the Home Arts-Needlework Department. .

ADDITIONAL AWARDS may be presented and will be posted in the Department.

DIVISION 5 - COUNTED THREAD

Charted design-counted by stitches per inch regardless of fabric count. To help alleviate confusion we request, if possible, that exhibitor bring a sample of fabric used or state the type on the entry form. If item or type of work is listed in the numbered classes, the same type of work may **NOT** be entered in "any item of merit not listed" class.

Pictures must have **wire attached to SCREWEYES** on the frame ready for hanging. Picture size not to exceed (24"X30") 720 square inches **including frame**. Craftsmanship is judged on the exhibit within the fabric size, but over-all impact does include the frame. All counted thread pictures are entered here, regardless of subject matter.

NOTE: Judging is on stitched area of the fabric. Measurements for class numbers are according to fabric size, not frame size. Judges may divide larger classes.

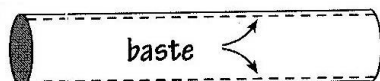

DIVISION 7 - QUILTING

QUILTS: Quilts **MUST** have a 6" sleeve stitched at the top (on the back) of the entry to accommodate a crosspole for hanging. **To make the sleeve:** Use a strip of fabric the full width of the quilt & 14" wide; fold the strip in half the full length; sew it together with a 1/2" seam; **(the result is a long tube/sleeve)**; turn it inside out which places the seam inside the tube/sleeve; iron the tube/sleeve with the seam in the middle; place the pressed tube/sleeve with the seam against the back of the quilt; pin the tube/sleeve to the quilt back **"one inch"** from the top; **Please hand stitch both the TOP and BOTTOM of the sleeve to the back of the quilt.** Stitching of the sleeve will not be judged. Take care to not go through to the front of the quilt. (See illustration below)

ILLUSTRATION:



Place sleeve about 1" from top back.

Baste both top and bottom of the sleeve to quilt back.

QUILT SIZE: Please list exact measurements of your quilt (i.e. 68x80) with the description on your entry form. Baby quilt approximately (30x40). Crib size approximately (30x60). Quilts approximately (72x90) and under will be classed as youth size. A "Y" beside the class number indicates youth size. Quilts approximately 80"x90" will be considered standard size. Judging will be done as youth or standard size only. The above information also applies to comforters. **THIS DIVISION IS A ONE PERSON PROJECT EXCEPT WHERE SPECIFICALLY STATED.**
