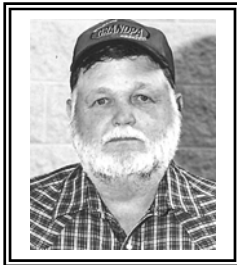

ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 2. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **LATE ENTRIES will not be accepted unless ample space is available.** If accepted, they will be charged a double entry fee and entry **MUST be received by Aug. 8.** You may submit your entries online. **Online deadline is Aug. 8.** Payment must be made with entry. Visa and MasterCard accepted online. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

- The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair.
Entry forms must be completely filled in and must include the name and registration number of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam.
Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but **no Exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.**
- This show follows the guidelines of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association Show Ring Code of Ethics. An exhibitor who violates any of those guidelines could forfeit all privileges and premiums.
- FEES:** An entry fee of \$10.00 per head will be charged. (\$20.00 per head if late entry accepted.) No refunds on entry fees.
- PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor's tickets for personal use at a cost of \$15.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$15.00 for every two animals entered. **Remittance** for entry fees and exhibitor passes **must accompany entries.**
- CAMPING:** Overnight camping for livestock exhibitors is **ONLY** available on the fairgrounds at **Boise Riverside RV Park**. To take advantage of the special Fair rate, for the first 50 spaces, of \$20 per day for full electrical, sewer and water hook-ups you must contact Boise Riverside RV Park, 6000 N. Glenwood, Boise, 83714. Phone: (208)375-7432. Website: www.BoiseRiversideRVPark.com. **Make your reservations and forward full payment no later than Aug. 1. All other camping on fairgrounds property is prohibited unless specifically authorized by a Livestock Superintendent and**

registered through the Western Idaho Fair Premium Office. License plate numbers of exhibitors who are authorized by Superintendent to watch animals at night will be registered with Security.

- PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. Exhibitor with pass must display parking permit in vehicle window for admittance at the **Livestock Entrance** off of Backstretch Blvd. at **Glenwood Street**. Designated parking areas for Livestock Exhibitors must be used. **NO vehicular movement** will be allowed inside the paid admission area during the hours the Fair is open to the public – (Noon to Midnight). Exception to this rule will be **Open Class Livestock Release times on Sunday and Monday, Aug. 21 & 22, and on Sunday, Aug. 28.** **Vehicles will not be allowed to enter this area after 10 a.m.** Vehicles bringing in livestock, feed, equipment etc. **MUST be removed to the parking area before 11:00 a.m.** If needed, **Fair personnel will deliver items from the vehicle parking area to the barn area during the hours the Fair is open.**

7. **ARRIVAL:** All open class Dairy Cattle may arrive after 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 23, and must be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 24. No vehicular movement will be allowed inside the paid admission area during the hours the Fair is open to the public. Livestock arriving on Tuesday, Aug. 23, prior to 11:00 p.m. must be walked in. **Any change from specified arrival time must have special permission from the Department Superintendent.**
8. **JUDGING SCHEDULE:**
Friday, Aug. 26 – 10:00 a.m. – Heifers – All Breeds.
Saturday, Aug. 27 – 9:30 a.m. – Brown Swiss & Guernsey Cows.
Saturday, Aug. 27 – 1:00 p.m. – Holstein & Jersey Cows.
 Supreme Champion Cow Award following Holstein and Jersey Show.
9. **RELEASE:** All Dairy Cattle will be released at 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 28, but are welcome to stay until Monday morning, Aug. 29. A **‘Release Slip’** will be required for transportation of livestock from the grounds. The department Superintendent issues release slips. Exhibitors leaving early without permission of the Superintendent forfeit all awards due them.
10. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the rules and regulations in the front of the Premium Book.
11. All exhibitors entering animals for competition must show title of ownership on registration certificates to accompany any animal prior to judging. Any transfer of animal exhibiting must have been made in new owner’s name prior to Fair date. The breed representative or his agent will check all registration papers.
12. Stalls will be assigned prior to the Fair by Western Idaho Fair personnel.
13. **Substitutions** will be allowed 24 hours prior to Fair judging. **Ringside entries** of single animals **are prohibited**. Entries must be made in **group classes**.
14. Prior to judging the Superintendent will inspect all exhibits to determine if they are entered in the class in which they should compete. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted due to clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office in order for a change to be made.
15. The Management of the Fair reserves the right to refuse admittance or remove from the Fairgrounds all unmanageable

or unsightly animals which may endanger the public safety, or be unfit for exhibition.

16. **No blocking chutes** will be allowed inside the Dairy Barn.
17. **All Bulls** except calves must have rings in their noses and be tied by two means – by their nose and either a neck strap or a halter.
18. Blankets on cattle are to be removed at the request of the Superintendent.
19. Cows 42 months old or older **must have produced** a calf carried to maturity within the past 18 months of the opening date of the Fair.
20. All livestock pens and stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily. No bedding will be allowed over the asphalt walkways. Aisle-ways must be kept clean and presentable.
21. The **Milking Parlor** will be open from 5:30 to 8:30 both morning and evening each day. It will be open other hours by appointment for exhibitors who wish to bag their cows for the next day’s show. Exhibitors are urged to utilize the **Milking Parlor** facility so that the milk can be handled in the most efficient manner. To safeguard milk quality, every precaution must be taken to see that no milk from animals recently treated with antibiotics enters the bulk tank. Milk proceeds will be divided equally per cow milked. Exhibitors will be paid according to the number of cows milked by them. The Barn Supervisor will keep a record of the number of cows milked. **No one under 9 years of age will be allowed in the milking parlor.**

All exhibitors making use of the Western Idaho Fair milking facilities are required to submit a signed and notarized certificate of rbST-free milk unless the producer is a member of Northwest Dairy Association. Paperwork will be mailed out with exhibitor tickets and also is available at the Premium Office.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All cattle must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. In-state cattle must have a veterinary certificate of general soundness and good health. All female cattle four (4) months of age or older should have a legible brucellosis vaccination tattoo. **Tattoo should be verified by veterinarian on Health Certificate.** Non-vaccinated females over twelve (12) months of age must have a negative brucellosis test with thirty (30) days of entry into the Fair, and may be entered for Show purposes only.

Out-of-state exhibitors should check with their state of origin regarding Brucellosis rules for re-entry into their state, or into another state, from Idaho. All cattle for breeding or for sale purposes at the Fair, must meet the Idaho change-of-ownership requirements. **Out-of-state** cattle must meet Idaho import requirements. All male and female dairy cattle, six (6) months of age and older, shall be officially indentified and tested for tuberculosis, with negative results, within sixty (60) days prior to entry into the State of Idaho. All male and female cattle over eighteen (18) months of age coming from Montana, shall be officially identified and must have negative brucellosis test within thirty (30) days prior to entry into the State of Idaho. All cattle over the age of six (6) months coming from California shall be officially identified and must have a negative TB test within thirty (30) days prior to entry into the State of Idaho.

Certificates of veterinary inspection should be dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair. All cattle are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

1. Bull Calf – born after Aug. 2010 and over 4 months old
2. Yearling Bull – born after Aug. 2009 and before Sept. 2010
3. **Grand Champion Bull**
Reserve Champion Bull
4. Spring Heifer Calf, born after March 2011 or later and over 4 months of age
5. Winter Heifer Calf, born after Nov. 2010 and before March 2011
6. Fall Heifer Calf, born after Aug. 2010 and before Dec. 2010
7. Summer Yearling Heifer, born after May 2010 and before Sept. 2010
8. Spring Yearling Heifer, born after Feb. 2010 and before June 2010
9. Winter Yearling Heifer, born after Nov. 2009 and before March 2010
10. Fall Yearling Heifer, born after Aug. 2009 and before Dec. 2009. Not in milk (Fall Yearlings that have freshened, shown in 2-yr. old class).
11. **Junior Champion Female** (Winners of classes 4 thru 10)
Reserve Junior Champion Female
12. Junior Best Three Females – Group to consist of 3 females under 2 years of age: All are to be bred and owned by exhibitor.....\$70 \$65 \$55 \$45 \$40

13. Junior two-year old cow, born after Feb. 2009 and before Sept. 2009
14. Senior two-year old cow, born after Aug. 2008 and before March 2009
15. Junior three-year old cow, born after Feb. 2008 and before Sept. 2008
16. Senior three-year old cow, born after Aug. 2007 and before March 2008
17. Cow, 4 year-old, born after Aug. 2006 and before Sept. 2007
18. Cow, 5 year-old, born after Aug. 2005 and before Sept. 2006
19. Aged Cow, 6 years or over, born before Sept. 2005

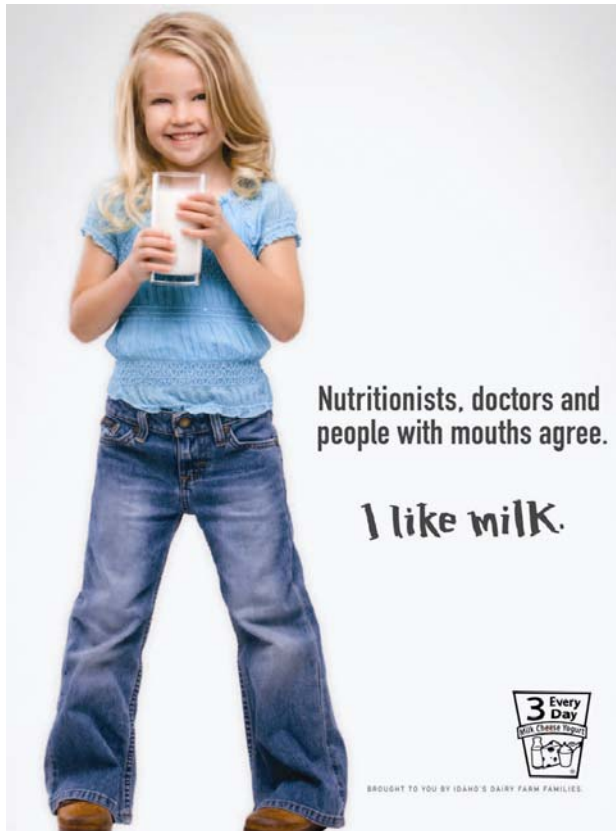

20. Dry Cow, 3 and 4 years old
21. Dry Cow, 5 years or over
22. **Senior Champion Female** (Winners of classes 13 thru 21)
Reserve Champion Female
23. **Grand Champion Female** – Junior and Senior Champions and Reserve Champions competing
Reserve Grand Champion Female
24. Best Female **bred and owned** by exhibitor.....**Trophy**
25. Best Three Females – All must be bred and owned by exhibitor. At least one must be 2 years of age or older. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.....\$70-\$65-\$55-\$45-\$35
26. Produce of Dam: To consist of 2 animals any age or sex; the produce of one cow. Dam must be named. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per dam.....\$70-\$65-\$55-\$45-\$35
27. Dam and Progeny: To consist of 2 animals, a dam and offspring of any age. Dam must be named. Exhibitor need not own both animals.....\$70-\$65-\$55-\$45-\$35
28. Breeder Herd of 5 females: This group, all owned by the exhibitor, consists of 2 females over 2 years of age, 2 females under 2 years of age and one any age. Three must be bred by the exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.
Premiums.....\$250 \$200 \$175 \$150 \$125
29. **Premium Breeder Award.** This award to be made to the breeder winning the most money in the **individual** classes, on the top eight (8) animals **bred by** him and exhibited by him or others. (No more than two (2) bulls can be included in the eight.) Best uddered cow class is not included.....**Banner**
30. **Premium Exhibitor Award.** This award to be made to the exhibitor winning the most money in the **individual** classes, on the top eight (8) animals **owned and exhibited** by him. No more than two (2) bulls can be included in the eight. Best uddered cow class is not included.....**Banner**

Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Awards will be given only when there is competition between two or more exhibitors.

Reserve Champion – Competition for Reserve Champion in both sexes shall include the animal winning second place in the individual class which furnished the Grand Champion in addition to first place winners in all other classes.





SPECIAL AWARDS SUPREME CHAMPION COW AWARD

The **Western Idaho Fair** will award a **Banner** to the winner. The Grand Champion Cow of each breed will compete for this award following the Saturday Breed Show

GUERNSEY AWARDS

Lincrest Farms will award a trophy to the Grand Champion Female.

Idaho Guernsey Breeders will award a trophy to the Reserve Champion Female and the Best Three Females Class. (class 25)

The Joe Pritzl Memorial Trophy will be awarded to First Place in Breeder Herd (class 28)

The Rolley Lincoln Memorial Plaque will be awarded to the Junior Champion Guernsey Female, sponsored by the Ankenman Family and Ankagem Farm.

JERSEY AWARD

The **Treasure Valley Jersey Club** will award a perpetual trophy to the Junior Champion Heifer.

DAIRY IMAGE AWARDS

United Dairymen of Idaho will award \$750 to the winners of these awards. **The Western Idaho Fair** will add \$50 to this amount.

Awards will be paid as follows:

1st - \$265 2nd - \$190 3rd - \$140 4th - \$115 5th - \$90

Judging for these awards will be done at various times during the day. Points will be given for best-kept and decorated stall area and best-cleaned aisle as well as cleanliness and condition of animals, thus presenting the best overall Dairy Image.
