ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 2. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **LATE ENTRIES will not be accepted unless ample space is available.** If accepted, they will be charged a double entry fee **and entry MUST be received by Aug. 8.** You may submit your entries online. **Online deadline is Aug. 8.** Payment must be made with entry. Visa and MasterCard accepted online. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

- The Management reserves the right to close entries **whenever** available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair.
- FEES:** \$1.50 per **RABBIT OR CAVY**, \$1.50 fur class, \$1.50 per single fryer and \$1.50 per meat pen. **No refund on entry fees.**
- PASSES:** Since exhibitors in this department are not required to come in daily to care for their animals, they may purchase **up to** ten single day passes at \$4.00 each **or** two 5 day passes at \$15.00 each. (They cannot purchase both 5 day and single day passes.) **Remittance** for entry fees and exhibitor passes **must accompany entries.**
- CAMPING:** Overnight camping for livestock exhibitors is **ONLY** available on the fairgrounds at **Boise Riverside RV Park**. To take advantage of the special Fair rate, for the first 50 spaces, of \$20 per day for full electrical, sewer and water hook-ups you must contact Boise Riverside RV Park, 6000 N. Glenwood, Boise, 83714. Phone: (208)375-7432. Website: www.BoiseRiversideRVPark.com. **Make your reservations and forward full payment no later than Aug. 1. All other camping on fairgrounds property is prohibited unless specifically authorized by a Livestock Superintendent and registered through the Western Idaho Fair Premium Office.** License plate numbers of exhibitors who are authorized by Superintendent to watch animals at night will be registered with Security.
- PARKING:** Each exhibitor will be given **ONE** vehicle parking permit. All Livestock exhibitors will **enter the Fairgrounds** on Backstretch Blvd. off Glenwood St. **NO VEHICULAR MOVEMENT** will be allowed inside the admission gates during the hours the Fair is open to the public – (Noon to midnight). Exception to this rule will be **Open Class Livestock Release** times on **SUNDAY** and

MONDAY, Aug. 21 & 22 and on SUNDAY, Aug. 28. **Vehicles will not be allowed to enter this area after 10 a.m.** See the map, with Livestock Exhibitor Parking areas marked, below:

6. **Small Animal Building Hours** will be Noon to 10:00 p.m. unless opened early for judging events or check-in.
7. **ARRIVAL:** Wednesday, Aug. 24 – **Rabbits, Cavies, Pigeons & Poultry** will be checked in from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. **VEHICLES INSIDE THE PAID ADMISSION AREA MUST BE REMOVED TO THE LIVESTOCK VEHICLE PARKING AREA BEFORE 11:00 A.M. PUSH CARTS OR HANDTRUCKS WILL MAKE TRANSPORT OF ANIMALS MUCH EASIER. FAIR PERSONNEL WILL ASSIST WITH TRANSPORT FROM VEHICLE PARKING AREA IF NEEDED.**
8. **JUDGING:** Each breed will show separately. See appropriate department for judging times. A judging schedule will be posted in the show room.
9. **RELEASE:** Exhibits will be released from **8:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.** on Sunday, Aug. 28. Exhibits must be picked up by 10:00 p.m. **Release Slips** will be issued by the Department Superintendent and will be required for transportation of livestock from the Fairgrounds. Exhibitors leaving early without permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all awards due them.
10. **CARE:** Feed, watering and care of your exhibits will be done by the Western Idaho Fair. No person shall handle any exhibits without the permission of the Superintendent or the owner.
11. Exhibitors are requested to read the **General Rules** in the front of this Premium Book. The Management reserves the right to substitute Judges and to interpret Rules and decide all questions not covered in the General Rules.
12. **All exhibits are entered and shown at the risk of the owner.** While all reasonable care will be exercised in the handling and protection of exhibits, the Officials, Superintendent or the Western Idaho Fair will in no case be responsible for loss. **Entry is deemed acceptance of the rules** in this Premium Book.
13. **COMPETITION:** Competition is defined as a contest for supremacy between two or more animals or articles or products owned by separate exhibitors. Two or more exhibits entered by the same person or household do not constitute competition.
14. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:**
RABBITS AND CAVIES
Rabbits and Cavies must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. Out-of-state rabbits and cavies must have a Certificate of Veterinary inspection dated no earlier than 30 days prior to the Western Idaho Fair. All animals are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

1. **Each exhibitor may enter up to 20 rabbits and 20 cavies, but not more than 60 per family/household, in the Rabbit and Cavy department. If an exhibitor would like to enter more rabbits or cavies, they must send a statement with their entries stating how many more they would like to enter. The Superintendent will notify the exhibitor after**

all late entries are received as to how many extra animals they will be allowed to enter. No late fee will be charged if the statement was received before original closing date for entries.

2. Official entry forms must include **Department #, Division #, Class # and Ear #** for each entry. See “Entry” and “Fees” listed above. Contact the Superintendent with any questions about class designation for entries. Entry changes will be accepted through Saturday, Aug. 20 10:00 p.m. After Aug. 20, only ear # change will be accepted through check-in. No changes accepted after check-in times. **If possible, notify Superintendent of any scratched entries before check in. All scratches must be submitted in writing at check in.**
3. Entries judged within American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) showroom classes. ARBA showroom classes are organized by breed, variety and class.
4. All rabbits must be identified by a permanent tattoo in the left ear. Freshly tattooed rabbits must have the excess ink removed before check in. Rabbits with illegible tattoos may be disqualified at the discretion of the judge. Cavies must have tattoo or ARBA approved ear tags.
5. Rabbits and Cavies must be shown in the name of the current owner when entries are made. Bunnies entered must be at least 8 weeks old or meet the minimum weight requirement stated in the ARBA Standard of Perfection. Cavies entered must weigh at least 12 ounces. **No animals are allowed in the building unless entered in the Fair.**
6. Trough drinking is provided but it is recommended that you bring your own water containers or water bottles.
7. Locks may be used on the cages but must not damage the cages in any way. Any damage to the cages will be charged to the exhibitor at check-out time. Exhibitors may lock cages with cable or zip ties.
8. Carriers will be available to take rabbits from unlocked cages to the show table for judging. Rabbits in locked pens will not be judged. Ties will be cut for judging.
9. **This is a sanctioned ARBA show.** It will be governed by the latest ARBA show rules and regulations in cooperation with the Western Idaho Fair. Only recognized ARBA breeds will be judged in classes listed in the Standard of Perfection or ARBA recognized working breeds or varieties. The National Convention of ARBA for 2011 will be held in Indianapolis, IN, Oct. 29 – Nov 2. To join ARBA contact: Eric Stewart, Executive Director, Box 5667, Bloomington, IL 61702.
