ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 2. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **LATE ENTRIES will not be accepted unless ample space is available.** If accepted, they will be charged a double entry fee and entry **MUST be received by Aug. 8.** You may submit your entries online. **Online deadline is Aug. 8.** Payment must be made with entry. Visa and MasterCard accepted online. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

1. The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Entry forms must be completely filled in and must include the name and registration number of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam.
Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but **no Exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.**
2. **FEES: Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, Santa Gertrudis and Exhibit Only Cattle:** An entry fee of \$12.00 per head will be charged. (\$24.00 per head if late entry accepted.)
Texas Longhorn: An entry fee of \$40.00 per class will be charged (\$52.00 if late entry accepted.)
No refunds on entry fees.
3. **PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$15.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$15.00 for every two animals entered. **Remittance for entry fees and exhibitor passes must accompany entries.**
4. **CAMPING:** Overnight camping for livestock exhibitors is **ONLY** available on the fairgrounds at **Boise Riverside RV Park**. To take advantage of the special Fair rate, for the first 50 spaces, of \$20 per day for full electrical, sewer and water hook-ups you must contact Boise Riverside RV Park, 6000 N. Glenwood, Boise, 83714. Phone: (208)375-7432. Website: www.BoiseRiversideRVPark.com. **Make your reservations and forward full payment no later than Aug. 1. All other camping on fairgrounds property is prohibited unless specifically authorized by a Livestock Superintendent and registered through the Western Idaho Fair Premium Office.** License plate numbers of exhibitors who are authorized by Superintendent to watch animals at night will be registered with Security.
5. **PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. Exhibitor with pass must display parking permit in vehicle window for admittance at the **Livestock Entrance** off of Backstretch Blvd. at **Glenwood Street**. Designated parking areas for Livestock Exhibitors must be used. **NO vehicular movement** will be allowed inside the paid admission area during the hours the Fair is open to the public – (Noon to Midnight). Exception to this rule will be **Open Class Livestock Release times on Sunday and Monday, Aug. 21 & 22, and on Sunday, Aug. 28. Vehicles will not be allowed to enter this area after 10 a.m.** Vehicles bringing in livestock, feed, equipment etc. **MUST be removed to the parking area before 11:00 a.m.** If needed, **Fair personnel will deliver items from the vehicle parking area to the barn area during the hours the Fair is open.**

6. **ARRIVAL:** Angus exhibits may arrive Wednesday, Aug. 17, after 8:00 a.m. and must be in place by 6:00 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 18.
Other Beef Breed exhibitors may arrive after 6:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 24 and must be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. that day.
7. **JUDGING SCHEDULE:**

8. **RELEASE:** Angus will be released at 10:00 p.m., Monday, Aug. 22, and must be out of the barn by 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 23.
Other Breeds must remain in place until 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 28. **All exhibitors must possess a "release slip" from the department Superintendent for transportation of livestock from the grounds. Exhibitors leaving early without the permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all awards due them.**
9. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the **Rules and Regulations** in front of this Premium Book.
10. All animals entered for competition must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor. Registration certificates must accompany all animals and be presented prior to judging. Registration certificates must be in the name of the owner or co-owner. Any transfer of animals must have been made prior to the Fair and the registration certificate must indicate the name of the current owner. Registration papers will be checked by the breed representative or his agent prior to judging.
11. **Substitutions will be allowed up to 24 hours prior to judging.** Substitutions will be allowed on a 1 for 1 basis within the same breed and must be of the same sex.

Ringside entry of single animals is prohibited. Any animal substituted must have current registration certificate and meet requirement set forth in Rule # 10 above.

12. Stalls will be assigned prior to the Fair by Western Idaho Fair personnel.
13. Prior to judging, the Superintendent will inspect all exhibits to determine if they are entered in the class in which they should compete. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted due to a clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office for a change to be made.
14. The Management of the Fair reserves the right to refuse admittance or remove from the Fairgrounds all unmanageable animals that may endanger public safety.
15. All animals, except calves, must have an extra neck rope. **BULLS**, yearlings and older, must be shown with nose tongs. No nurse cows stalled in the barn.
16. Livestock pens and stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily.
17. Electrical power in the livestock barn is limited. Exhibitors are permitted to bring generators if they desire.
18. There will be a designated area outside of the Livestock Barn where **"blocking chutes" may be placed.**
19. **TIE-OUTS:** Exhibitors using tie-out areas at night can take animals out of the barn after **9:00 p.m.** Night tie-out area is limited. Tie-out area must have manure removed and pavement swept each a.m.
20. There will be an exhibitor's meeting held for each section of the Fair. The Superintendent will announce the time and place.
21. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** All cattle must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. In-state cattle must have a veterinary certificate of general soundness and good health. All female cattle four (4) months of age or older should have a legible brucellosis vaccination tattoo. Non-vaccinated females over twelve (12) months of age must have a negative brucellosis test within thirty (30) days of entry into the Fair, and may be entered for show purposes only. **Out-of-state exhibitors** should check with their state of origin regarding brucellosis rules for re-entry into their state, or into another state, from Idaho. All cattle for breeding or for sale purposes at the Fair, must meet the Idaho change-of-ownership requirements. **Out-of-state** cattle must meet Idaho import requirements. **All male and female cattle, six (6) months of age and older, shall be officially identified and tested for tuberculosis, with negative results, within sixty (60) days prior to entry into the State of Idaho.** Out-of-state bulls, imported for exhibition at livestock shows are not required to be tested for Trichomoniasis, provided the bulls will be returned to state of origin, will not be exposed to female cattle, and will not be offered for sale. All male and female cattle over eighteen (18) months of age coming from Montana and Wyoming shall be officially identified and must have a negative brucellosis test within thirty (30) days prior to entry into the State of Idaho. Certificates of Veterinary inspection should be dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair. All cattle are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

SPECIAL AWARDS

The Western Idaho Fair will award a special **Barn Prize** of \$25 to the Exhibitor with the best-kept and decorated stall area and best-cleaned aisle. This award will be presented in both the first and second sections of the Fair.

The Idaho Angus Association will award trophies to the Grand and Reserve Grand Champions of the Angus Show.

JUNIOR SHOW SCHEDULES

Junior Angus Show – **Friday, Aug. 19** – **1:00 p.m.**
Junior Shorthorn Show – **Thursday, Aug. 25** – **10:00 a.m.**
Junior Hereford Show – **Friday, Aug. 26** – **10:00 a.m.**

Exhibitors: All exhibitors showing breeding animals in the Junior Show must be age 9 by January 1 of current year and no more than age 21 by January 1 of current year. Exhibitors must also be current/paid members of the Idaho Junior Association **and** either the American Association or the American Junior Association by entry deadline.

If an exhibitor wants to show a steer in the Angus Steer Show, they must be entered by entry deadline and be a paid member of the Idaho Junior Angus Association by show day.

Contact the Junior Advisor(s) listed below for more details or information about membership. Registration certificates for

breeding animals must list the junior exhibitor as sole owner (no co-ownership allowed) and dated at least 30 days prior to entry deadline.

Transfer and registration deadline is 30 days prior to show day. For the Bred & Owned Division, the junior exhibitor must be listed on the registration paper as both the breeder and first owner of the animal.

Junior Angus Cattle: Date of ownership after July 1, 2011 is **process date**, prior to July 1, 2011 will be **issue date**.

Guidelines and Rules: The Junior Show at the Western Idaho Fair is first and foremost governed by all printed and implied rules and guidelines listed in the Idaho Junior Association Handbook and second by those listed in the Western Idaho Fair Exhibitor's Handbook. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have a copy of both books prior to the show and to be aware of the contents of both. Idaho Junior Association Handbooks can be obtained by contacting the Junior Advisor(s) listed above. The fair office does not have Idaho Junior Association Handbooks available. All participating exhibitors agree to abide by said rules and guidelines and exhibit good sportsmanship. Violations can result in forfeiture of premiums, expulsion from the junior show and/or removal from the fairgrounds. Information about and authority to enforce said guidelines and rules for the Junior Show is the responsibility of (but not limited to) the Idaho Junior Advisor(s), Junior Show Chair(s), Officers of the Idaho Association, Representative(s) of the American Association and the Western Idaho Fair Beef Superintendent(s).

Breeding Entries: A Junior Entry form is required to enter the Junior Show. There is no additional stall fee or entry fee for junior **breeding** entries if the same animal has also been entered in the Open Breed Show where a fee is required. If the animal(s) are not entered in the Open Breed Show, then a \$12.00 fee must accompany the Junior entry form. Please note on the entry form if the female entered is "Owned" or "Bred & Owned". "Bred & Owned" means that the exhibitor owned the dam of the calf before the dam was bred. Only "Bred & Owned" bulls can be shown in the junior show. For an animal to be entered as "Bred & Owned", the junior exhibitor must be listed on the registration certificate as the first breeder **and** first owner. Junior (and Open) entry forms may be found in this Premium Book and online at www.idahofair.com or you can stop by the Premium Office to pick one up.

Check-In: All cattle must have legible tattoo corresponding with the registration certificate for that animal. All cattle (both Junior and Open entries) must be accompanied at check-in by the **original** registration certificate. At check-in staff members of the American Association will verify the registration certificates and tattoo numbers of all animals entered for both the Junior and Open shows. Missing or illegible tattoos or missing registration certificates could result in the animal not showing in either show. Any registration certificates not listing the junior member as sole owner will result in the animal not showing in the Junior Show, though they may still be eligible to show in the Open Breed Show.

Angus Steer Show: You must first see "Class 30: Angus Steer" to see if your animal is eligible to participate in the Junior Angus Steer Show. If the animal is eligible you must send in your completed Junior Angus Entry form with the \$12.00 entry fee by entry deadline. *You cannot enter on show day.* You must also provide verification at check-in deadline that your steer is at least 50% Angus. You must still submit the \$12.00 entry fee even if you are stalling your steer in the 4-H or FFA stall areas and not in the Angus stall area.

Angus Awards: The Western Idaho Fair will contribute \$500.00 to the Junior Angus Show. Also contributing: Idaho Angus

Association, Idaho Junior Association, Boise Valley Angus Club, individual breeders, and local business. The American Angus Association will contribute funds if there are over 50 head of junior cattle checked in for at least two years in a row. **Premiums** will be paid by the Idaho Junior Angus Show Chair and/or the Idaho Junior Angus Advisor.

Classes: Individual classes will be determined after entries close. Remember that all cattle must be registered solely in the exhibitor's name at least 30 days prior to show day.

Only **registered Angus** cattle that meet the age requirements listed within this classification are eligible to receive premium participation and be counted in the total number of head shown. Champion and Reserve Champion placings are not counted in number of head shown.

SHOWMANSHIP: Exhibitors wishing to participate in the Idaho Junior Showmanship Contest are not required to pay an additional fee if they have also entered a breeding animal in the Junior Show. If they have not entered a breeding animal, they may enter the Showmanship Contest the day of the show by filling out an entry form before the show and paying a \$12.00 entry fee. They may use their own breeding animal or they can borrow a breeding animal that is entered in either the Junior or Open Shows to show in the ring. (No steers are allowed in showmanship.) **All divisions are based on the exhibitor's age as of Jan. 1 of the current year.** The judge will place a Grand and a Reserve winner in each division and may place more exhibitors if they so choose.

46. Pee-Wee Division. Exhibitor must be less than 9 years of age

Check in: All Angus Cattle must be checked in by 6:00 p.m., Thursday, Aug 18.

AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION®— THE BUSINESS BREED

PARTICIPATION STATEMENT AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri, will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the Open Class Division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year.

Premium from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes (i.e. get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire or breeder six-head classes).

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up.

Any animal upon check-in that does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with calf at side, calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have proof of registration at check in.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2: Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules, Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring. **Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited.** This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. **Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.**

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such shows shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications is not eligible to show in the cow/calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class.

Class:

1. Cow/Calf Class: cows three (3) years of age and younger, cows born Jan. 2008 through Aug. 2009. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be born Nov. 13, 2010 or after. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class.
2. Cow/Calf Class: cows four (4) years of age and older, cows must be born Dec. 31, 2007 or earlier. Calf must be the cow's most recent calf and be born Nov. 13, 2010 or after.
3. **Grand Champion Cow/Calf pair (1-2)**
4. **Reserve Grand Champion Cow/Calf pair**
Grand and reserve grand champion cow/calf pair do not show for grand champion female and are ineligible to compete in the get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire and breeder's six-head classes.
5. Junior Heifer Calves, calved on or after March 1, 2011
6. Junior Heifer Calves, calved February, 2011
7. Junior Heifer Calves, calved January, 2011
