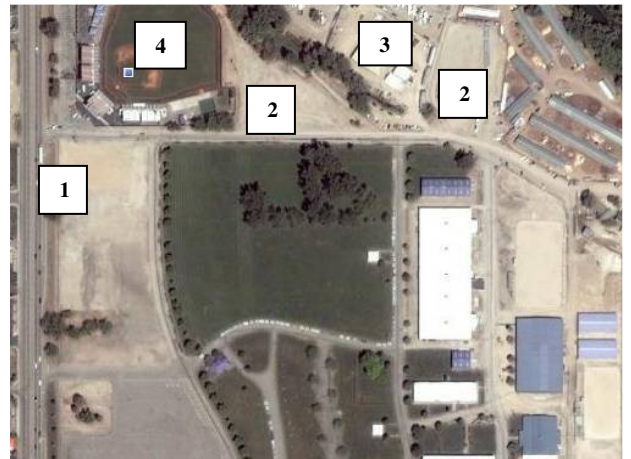

ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 3. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **LATE ENTRIES will not be accepted unless ample space is available.** If accepted, they will be charged a double entry fee **and entry MUST be received by Aug. 9.** You may submit your entry forms online. **Online deadline is Aug. 9.** Payment must be made with entry. Visa and MasterCard accepted. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

- The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. **RINGSIDE ENTRIES ARE PROHIBITED. To change or add classes for animals already entered, exhibitor must notify the Premium Office by the evening before the Show.** Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Entry forms must be completely filled in and must include the name and breed of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers of all stallions and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam of all stallions entered.
Draft Horse in all cases refers to the Draft Horse Breeds as listed in Divisions 1 through 6.
Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but **no Exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.**
- FEES:** An entry fee of \$10.00 per head will be charged. (\$20.00 per head if late.) Entry fee for all Hitches and Log Pulling is \$3 per class. **No refunds on entry fees.**
- PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$15.00 each. Additional passes may be purchased for \$4.00 each per day as needed for drivers, handlers, etc., listed on entry form. **Remittance** for entry fees and exhibitor passes **must accompany entries.**
- PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. Exhibitor with pass must display parking permit in vehicle window for admittance at **LIVESTOCK ENTRANCE ON BACKSTRETCH BLVD. OFF GLENWOOD ST.** Designated parking areas for Livestock Exhibitors must be used. **NO VEHICULAR MOVEMENT** will be allowed inside the paid admission area during the hours the Fair is open to the public - (11:00 a.m. to midnight). Exception to this rule will be **OPEN CLASS** Livestock Release times on **SUNDAY** and **MONDAY**, Aug. 23 & 24, and on **SUNDAY**, Aug. 30. **Vehicles will not be allowed to enter this area after 10 a.m.** Vehicles bringing in livestock, feed, equipment etc. **MUST be removed to the parking area before 11:00 a.m.**

If needed, FAIR PERSONNEL WILL DELIVER ITEMS FROM THE VEHICLE PARKING AREA TO THE BARN AREA DURING THE HOURS THE FAIR IS OPEN.

Storage pods will be available in the designated area south of the trackside arena to store tack, feed, equipment, etc. Because of limited space, livestock and horse trailers can **no longer be parked** inside of the Fairgrounds.

- CAMPING:** Overnight camping for livestock exhibitors is available on the fairgrounds at the **On the River R.V. Park** only. By contract, 25 spaces are set aside at \$13.75 per day for full electrical, sewer and water hook-ups. (Regular price is \$31.00.) The Western Idaho Fair will subsidize additionally needed spaces at the discounted rate to encourage livestock

exhibitor participation. **In order to take advantage of this offer, you must call ON THE RIVER R. V. PARK, at 6000 Glenwood, Boise, ID 83714 (Phone 208-375-7432). Make your reservation and forward full payment no later than Aug. 1.** Due to contractual obligations with the **On the River R.V. Park, all other camping on fairgrounds property is prohibited unless specifically authorized by a livestock Superintendent and registered through the Western Idaho Fair Premium Office.** License plate numbers of exhibitors who are authorized by Superintendents to watch animals at night will be registered with Security.

6. **ARRIVAL:** Draft Horses may arrive after 6:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 25 and **MUST** be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. that day. Please contact Superintendent for special arrangements for late arrivals.
7. **STALLS:** Stalls are available in the Draft Horse barn at no cost to the Exhibitor. **The number of stalls required must be reserved at the time entries are submitted.** If space for tack and harness is needed, this too should be reserved. Anyone interested in dressing up their tack and harness space with displays, trophies, banners etc. is encouraged to do so as it is of great interest to the public.
8. **JUDGING SCHEDULE:**
All events to be held in the Trackside Arena.
Thursday, Aug. 26-Draft Horse Halter Classes- 2:00 p.m.
Followed by Riding Classes (approx. 3:30 p.m.)
Friday, Aug. 27-Draft Horse-Quality Hitches- 1:00 p.m.
Friday, Aug. 27-Draft Horse Log Pulling & Exhibition Sled Race - 7:00 p.m.
Saturday, Aug. 28- Performance Hitches- 3:00 p.m.
Sunday, Aug. 29- Draft Horse **Fun Day** – 1:00 p.m. (No entry fee, no premiums) Events: Wagon Obstacle, Log Pulling, Sled Race. **Western Idaho Fair** will award a trophy to First Place in each event.
9. **RELEASE:** All exhibitors must obtain a "**Release Slip**" from the Department Superintendent for transportation of livestock off the grounds. Draft Horses will be released at 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 29, but are welcome to stay until Monday morning, Aug. 30. **NO EARLY RELEASES.**
10. All animals shall be entered in the owner's name. The date of computing age shall be Jan. 1. No animals will be accepted for entry unless they are in show condition.
11. Prior to Judging, the Superintendent will inspect exhibits in the department to determine if they are entered in the proper class. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted due to clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office in order for a change to be made.
12. **All stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily.** Exhibitors must be prepared to care for animals all day. Exhibitors are responsible for care and security of their tack and equipment.
13. Exhibitors must be prepared to show registration papers on all stallions entered.
14. The Management reserves the right to reject, accept conditionally, and to cancel any entries and award prizes without claim for damages.
15. An exhibitor who violates any of the rules set forth in this Premium Book will forfeit all privileges and premiums. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the rules and regulations in the front of the Premium Book. **Entry is deemed acceptance of the Rules.**
16. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** Draft horses must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. Out-of-

state draft horses must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary inspection dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair. Out-of-state draft horses **will be** required to have a current (12 months) E.I.A. (Coggins) test. Please contact your veterinarian before entering. All draft horses are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds. A West Nile Virus Vaccination is not required, but recommended.

NOTE: For stallions, the issuing veterinarian must write one of the four statements relative to Equine Viral Ateritis (EVA) "status" on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. These EVA status statements are defined in the Idaho State Department of Agriculture's Animal Import Rules.

ADDITIONAL RULES FOR QUALITY AND PERFORMANCE HITCHES

1. All harness, equipment and vehicles will be subject to a safety inspection. **EVERY PRECAUTION SHOULD BE TAKEN BY THE EXHIBITOR TO INSURE THE SAFETY OF OTHERS.**
2. In all Hitch Classes where the Judging criteria are not listed, manner of scoring will be up to the Judge. In all cases, **JUDGES DECISIONS ARE FINAL.**
3. No Premiums will be paid to entries that did not have a complete and qualified run. This includes classes that pay "all others".
4. Hitches of four, six or eight in hand, constitute **one** driver with that many horses **in his/her hands.** A penalty will be

imposed if the driver requires assistance with the lines while competing.

5. Contestants experiencing an equipment breakdown may request a 3 minute gate hold.
6. Neat Western attire is required for Driver and assistants in all Hitch classes. Long dresses are optional for ladies.
7. ENTRY FEE for all Hitches and Log Pulling is \$3 per class and must accompany entry.
8. Other Draft Breeds will not compete directly with the Shire, Percheron, Belgian, Clydesdale and Suffolk breeds in Division 8 (Quality Hitches) Division 9 (Log Pulling) and Division 10 (Performance Hitches), but will show directly after those breeds finish their classes.

Five points will be subtracted for each infraction. Infractions will be stepping on or over ropes or moving the pylons. Breaking the pattern will be a disqualification. The contestant with the

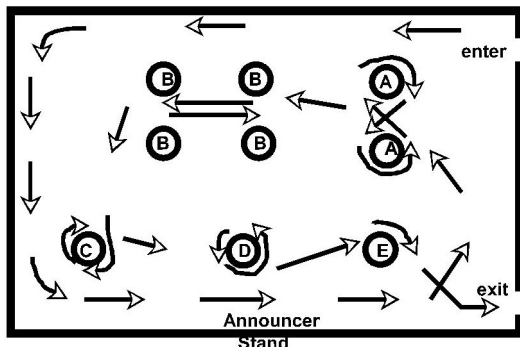
highest score will win. The event will be timed in case of a tie in points. Pylons will be reset as necessary during competition. Exhibitors may enter and drive as many teams as they wish, but all teams must be ready when event is called. Order will be drawn in arena before class.

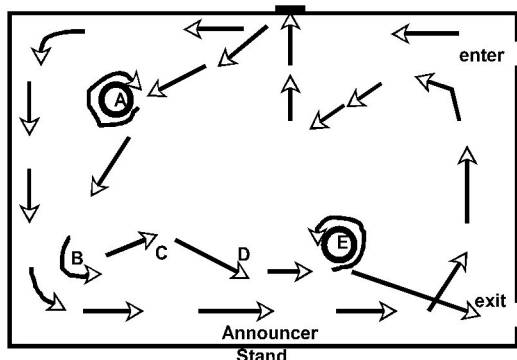
PATTERN #1 Class 36, 37, 38 and 39



Enter at a trot, circle entire arena counter clockwise.

1. Figure 8 around markers "A", spaced 36 ft. apart.
2. Stop and back. Stop with back wheels even with marker "B" and back until front wheels are even with marker "B".
3. Circle marker "C" to the right with rear wheel as close to marker as possible without touching or knocking it over.
4. Circle marker "D" to the left with rear wheel as close to marker as possible without touching or knocking it over.
5. Drive around marker "E" then exit and line up.
6. Classes will be judged in driver ability and horses handiness.

PATTERN #2 Class 40, 41, 42, 43 & 44



Enter at a trot, circle entire arena counter clockwise.

1. Back to loading dock within boundary and continue. Fanning should be shown while docking.
2. Circle marker "A" with rear wheel as close as possible to marker without touching or knocking it over. This is a RIGHT TURN.
3. Drive through markers "B", "C" and "D".
4. Circle marker "E" with rear wheel as close as possible to marker without touching or knocking it over. This is a LEFT TURN.

5. Exit and line up.

6. Classes will be judged in driver ability and horses handiness.

NOTE: While there is no class for an Eight Horse Hitch, anyone wishing to hook eight will receive \$60. They will not be judged but will perform immediately following Class 45 (Exhibition Driving).

IN ALL PERFORMANCE HITCHES, CONTESTANTS WILL COMPETE ONE AT A TIME, EXIT ARENA AND LINE UP, THEN RETURN TO ARENA WHEN ALL HAVE COMPETED.
