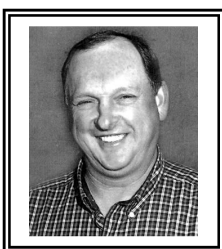

ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 3. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **LATE ENTRIES will not be accepted unless ample space is available.** If accepted, they will be charged a double entry fee **and entry MUST be received by Aug. 9.** You may submit your entry forms online. **Online deadline is Aug. 9.** Payment must be made with entry. Visa and MasterCard accepted. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

- The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space (**two animals per pen**) is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. **Entry forms must be completely filled out** and must include the name and registration number of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam.
Ringside entries are prohibited; groups must be entered at time of entry. Members of groups must be entered and shown in appropriate individual classes.
- FEES:** A charge of \$5.00 per animal will be made. (\$10.00 per animal if late entry) A charge of \$2.00 per entry will be made for fleece. **No refunds on entry fees.**
- PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$15.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$15.00 for every three animals entered. **Remittance for entry fees and exhibitor passes must accompany entries.**
- PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. Exhibitor with pass must display parking permit in vehicle window for admittance at **LIVESTOCK ENTRANCE ON BACKSTRETCH BLVD. OFF GLENWOOD ST.** Designated parking areas for Livestock Exhibitors must be used. **NO VEHICULAR MOVEMENT** will be allowed inside the paid admission area during the hours the Fair is open to the public - (11:00 a.m. to midnight). Exception to this rule will be **OPEN CLASS** Livestock Release times on **SUNDAY and MONDAY, Aug. 23 & 24,** and on **SUNDAY, Aug. 30. Vehicles will not be allowed to enter this**

area after 10 a.m. Vehicles bringing in livestock, feed, equipment etc. **MUST be removed to the parking area before 11:00 a.m.** **If needed, FAIR PERSONNEL WILL DELIVER ITEMS FROM THE VEHICLE PARKING AREA TO THE BARN AREA DURING THE HOURS THE FAIR IS OPEN.**

5. **CAMPING:** Overnight camping for livestock exhibitors is available on the fairgrounds at the **On the River R.V. Park** only. By contract, 25 spaces are set aside at \$13.75 per day for full electrical, sewer and water hook-ups. (Regular price is \$31.00.) The Western Idaho Fair will subsidize additionally needed spaces at the discounted rate to encourage livestock exhibitor participation. **In order to take advantage of this offer, you must call ON THE RIVER R. V. PARK, at 6000 Glenwood, Boise, ID 83714 (Phone 208-375-7432). Make your reservation and forward full payment no later than Aug. 1.** Due to contractual obligations with the **On the River R.V. Park, all other camping on fairgrounds property is prohibited unless specifically authorized by a livestock Superintendent and registered through the Western Idaho Fair Premium Office.** License plate numbers of exhibitors who are authorized by Superintendents to watch animals at night will be registered with Security.
6. **ARRIVAL:** Sheep may arrive after 5:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 25 and must be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. **Any change from specified arrival time must have special permission from the Department Superintendent. PENS WILL BE ASSIGNED AND POSTED IN THE SHEEP SHOW RING.**
Fleeces must be delivered to the Wool Booth between **9:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m.** (See Division 15 Rules)

The Breed with the **most entries** will show at this time. Selection will be posted in the show ring after substitutions have been made on Thursday night.

8. **RELEASE:** Exhibits must remain in place until 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 29. A "**Release Slip**" from the Department Superintendent will be required for transportation of livestock from the grounds.
9. **CHECK IN:** All registration papers must correspond with ear tags (official registration) and be checked in with the Superintendent 24 hours prior to the scheduled showing. **Substitutions:** A clerk and the Superintendent will be available in the department to make substitutions on **Thursday, Aug. 26, from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.** Substitutions will be allowed up to 12 hours prior to judging. Prior to Judging, the Superintendent will inspect all exhibits in the department to determine if they are entered correctly. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted, due to clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office in order for a change to be made.
10. **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE FITTED FOR SHOW AND MUST BE PRESENTED IN THE SHOW RING IN ORDER TO RECEIVE PREMIUMS.**
11. There will be a limit of **TWO PREMIUMS** in the **Individual Classes** and **ONE PREMIUM** in the **Pair and Group Classes Per Exhibitor.**
12. All livestock pens and stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m.

daily and exhibitors are responsible to see that all aisles by their exhibits are clean and free of equipment and clutter. Trimming and grooming in the aisles will not be allowed. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning any areas used for trimming and grooming, including those outside the barn.

13. All pens must be identified with the exhibitor's name and breed of sheep. Exhibitors are encouraged to add additional information about their breed.
14. Only one person will be allowed to assist the showman or owner in the ring.
15. Exhibitors are requested to read the rules and regulations in the front of this Premium Book carefully. **Entry is deemed acceptance of the Rules.**

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Sheep must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. All breeding sheep of any age must be identified with a Federal Scrapie Program identification number. Out-of-state sheep must meet Idaho import requirements and must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary inspection dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair. All sheep on the fairgrounds will be checked by an inspector from the Idaho Sheep Commission.

Only those animals that have lamb teeth will be eligible to show in lamb classes, and only those animals with yearling teeth will be permitted to show in yearling classes.

The class will be limited to two (2) animals per exhibitor. **All lambs must have been slick sheared at least 14 days before show date.** Exhibitors must check with the Superintendent for time schedule for weighing. Market Lambs are not eligible for any other classes.

***PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD:** This award to be made to the exhibitor winning the most points in the **individual** classes on the top five (5) animals **owned and exhibited** by him. (No more than two (2) rams can be included in the five).....**Blanket**

*To receive either of the above awards, there must be two or more exhibitors in each breed.

THE WESTERN IDAHO FAIR will award a special **BARN PRIZE** of \$25 to the Exhibitor with the best-kept and decorated pens and best- cleaned aisle.

IDAHO WOOL GROWERS ASSOCIATION

THE IDAHO WOOL GROWERS ASSOCIATION will award \$20 for the most attractive exhibit promoting lamb & wool.

THE IDAHO WOOL GROWERS ASSOCIATION will award \$20 for both the Supreme Champion Ram and Ewe Fleece and \$10 for both the Reserve Supreme Champion Ram and Ewe Fleece.

SPECIAL EWES AND LAMB CLASS

All Breeds including Crossbreeds eligible to compete.

PREMIUMS: 1st-\$50 2nd-\$35 3rd-\$15

Lambs: age 1 day to 30 days.

Entries may be made on first day of open sheep show. Judging will be done by three Judges selected by the Superintendent. Ewe and Lambs will be judged on the following:

- General Appearance and Conformation of Ewe and Lamb.....50%
- Decoration and Cleanliness of Pen.....30%
- Pen Display most promoting the Sheep Industry.....20%

DIVISION 14

SPECIAL JUNIOR SHEEP SHOW

Owner and exhibitor of the sheep must be 18 years old or under the day of the show. All breeds will be judged together. Rules listed at the beginning of this department also apply to Junior Show exhibitors. The animals in these classes may be registered or commercial sheep.

There is no additional entry fee if the same animal has also been entered in the Open Show. If the animal(s) are not entered in the Open Show, then a \$3.00 per animal fee must accompany the entry form.

DIVISION 15- WOOL

Entry Deadline - Aug. 3

Wool Judging: Thursday, Aug. 26, 2:00 p.m.

Purpose:

To create an awareness of the many qualities of wool and its uses. To exhibit results of the **improvement programs** in the sheep and wool industry. To **encourage proper preparation** and grading of wool for market.

RULES:

1. Fleeces must be delivered to the Wool Booth in the Livestock barn between **9:00 a.m.** and no later than **12:00 p.m.** on Wednesday, Aug. 25. The Department Superintendent will give exhibitors an entry tag for each class. The card will include Exhibitor’s name, sheep breed and date sheared. **THESE CARDS MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE THE FLEECE WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
2. All articles entered shall be under the control of the Superintendent of this department. Every precaution will be taken to insure the safety of the exhibits, but the Exhibitor **assumes all responsibility in case of loss or theft and in no case will the Management of the Western Idaho Fair or the Superintendent be responsible for loss or injury.**
3. Fleeces shall not be more than 12 months growth. The definition of 12 months shall be the definition commonly accepted by the wool trade.
4. All fleeces entered must have been sheared **from sheep owned by the exhibitor.**
5. Exhibitor will be allowed **8 entries overall and limited to winning two premiums per class.**
6. A fleece from purebred sheep must be entered in the Breed classification and a fleece from grade or crossbred sheep must be entered in the Commercial classification. A fleece may **NOT** be entered in both the Purebred class and the Commercial class.
7. Fleeces may be from either sex, excluding wethers.
8. All fleeces must be skirted with **bellies and tags out.**
9. Fleeces **CANNOT** be accepted if:
 - A. Tied with other than paper twine-but **need not be tied.** (The Fair will provide clear plastic bags for the Show.)
 - B. Show insoluble paint.
 - C. Show excessive dung tags, burrs or dung, urine stains and being cotted.
 - D. Weak or broken (fleeces will be disqualified at time of entry or judging)
10. Fleeces will **not be accepted after 12:00 p.m. Wednesday.**
11. After screening, some fleeces may be removed, so the better fleeces can be properly displayed.
12. Judges decisions are **final.** Judge may disqualify any entry for just cause and may reassign entries to categories as seem proper.
13. **RELEASE:** Exhibitors must obtain a “Release Slip” from the Department Superintendent before removing exhibits from the grounds, at 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 29.

SILENT AUCTION (SPECIAL)

Again this year we will have a silent auction to encourage clean, skirted fleeces (must be very clean). Home spinners, spinning groups and the general public will be notified of the silent auction.

Fleeces to be entered in the silent auction will be open for bid after judging on Thursday. You may indicate the minimum price you would accept when checking in.

The public will write their bid on a ticket attached to the fleece. Bidding will stop at 7:00 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 28.

It will be your responsibility to make contact with the winning bidder. In case of a sale of a fleece, the Superintendent or the Western Idaho Fair will not be held responsible for the collection of money or delivery of the fleece.

Fleeces cannot be checked out until 7:30 p.m. Sunday evening.

If you would like your fleece to be entered in the silent auction, please bring it to the attention of the wool supervisor at time of entry.
