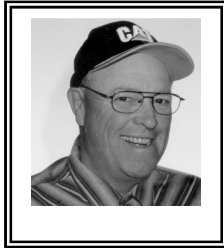

ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 3. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **LATE ENTRIES will not be accepted unless ample space is available.** If accepted, they will be charged a double entry fee **and entry MUST be received by Aug. 9.** You may submit your entry forms online. **Online deadline is Aug. 9.** Payment must be made with entry. Visa and MasterCard accepted. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies

- ENTRIES:** The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Online entries are encouraged. Entry forms must be completely filled out and must include the herd name, names and registration numbers of all goats entered and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam. **Exhibitors leaving off herd name will forfeit the right to compete for Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor.** All animals shown in Group classes must have been shown in their regular individual age class. Group classes may be listed as "Entry", **except the Sire and Dam classes which MUST have the sire or dam listed.** No doe may compete in more than one class, or receive more than one premium, except as part of a pair, group or Championship. Goats in Group classes may not participate as part of two separate groups in group classes. Exhibitors may make as many entries in individual classes as needed. **A maximum of two entries per Exhibitor will be allowed in group classes. No Exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class. Exhibitors MUST use separate entry forms for each breed. Submit the forms as one entry, but do not mix breeds on one form. One exhibitor per entry allowed.** An exhibitor may present an entry as 'agent/handler' for the owner, but must follow all rules as set forth in this premium book.
- FEES:** Dairy Goats: A fee of \$3.00 per entry per class will be charged (\$6.00 per class if late entry accepted) for both

individual as well as group classes. No pen fee will be charged. Please indicate how many pens you want to reserve. (Pens are 6' x 6', a maximum of 3 adults or 6 kids under 6 months of age will be allowed per pen).

- Pygmy Goat Fees: see department.
- CHECK IN:** All registration papers must be checked in with the show committee by 5:00 p.m. Wednesday. No other check in times are available. Substitutions will be allowed during check in. No late check in or substitutions will be allowed at the Premium Office. All exhibitors have an entry deadline. Have paperwork in order prior to arrival at the Fair.
The Show Management reserves the right to accept post entries only to complete breed classes for sanctions. No refunds on entry fees.
RINGSIDE ENTRIES ARE PROHIBITED.
 - PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$15.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$15.00 for every three animals entered. **Remittance for entry fees and exhibitor passes must accompany entries.**
 - PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. Exhibitor with pass must display parking permit in vehicle window for admittance at **LIVESTOCK ENTRANCE ON BACKSTRETCH BLVD. OFF GLENWOOD ST.** Designated parking areas for Livestock

Exhibitors must be used. **NO VEHICULAR MOVEMENT** will be allowed inside the paid admission area during the hours the Fair is open to the public - (11:00 a.m. to midnight). Exception to this rule will be **OPEN CLASS** Livestock Release times on **SUNDAY** and **MONDAY**, Aug. 23 & 24, and on **SUNDAY**, Aug. 30. **Vehicles will not be allowed to enter this area after 10 a.m.** Vehicles bringing in livestock, feed, equipment etc. **MUST be removed to the parking area before 11:00 a.m.**

If needed, FAIR PERSONNEL WILL DELIVER ITEMS FROM THE VEHICLE PARKING AREA TO THE BARN AREA DURING THE HOURS THE FAIR IS OPEN.

6. **CAMPING:** Overnight camping for livestock exhibitors is available on the fairgrounds at the **On the River R.V. Park** only. By contract, 25 spaces are set aside at \$13.75 per day for full electrical, sewer and water hook-ups. (Regular price is \$31.00.) The Western Idaho Fair will subsidize additionally needed spaces at the discounted rate to encourage livestock exhibitor participation. **In order to take advantage of this offer, you must call ON THE RIVER R. V. PARK, at 6000 Glenwood, Boise, ID 83714 (Phone 208-375-7432). Make your reservation and forward full payment no later than Aug. 1.** Due to contractual obligations with the **On the River R.V. Park, all other camping on fairgrounds property is prohibited unless specifically authorized by a livestock Superintendent and registered through the Western Idaho Fair Premium Office.** License plate numbers of exhibitors who are authorized by Superintendents to watch animals at night will be registered with Security.
7. **ARRIVAL:** Dairy Goats may arrive on the grounds between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 25. No goats allowed to arrive after 10:00 a.m. without Department Superintendent permission and current vet certificate. **NO unloading will be allowed before 5:00 a.m. Wednesday. Do not set up awnings on north end of building until after 10:00 a.m.**
8. **JUDGING SCHEDULE:**
Saturday, Aug. 28-8:00 a.m.-Dairy Goat-Junior Doe
 Show Classes 1-10

Sunday, Aug. 29- 8:00 a.m.-Dairy Goat-Senior Doe
 Show Classes 11-25

9. **RELEASE:** Exhibits must remain in place until 8:00p.m. Sunday, Aug. 29 but are welcome to stay until Monday morning, Aug. 30. All exhibitors must obtain a "**Release Slip**" from the Department Superintendent for transportation of livestock from the grounds. **Exhibitors leaving early without the permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all awards due them.**
10. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the **Rules & Regulations** in the front of this premium book.
11. **REGISTRATION:** A registration/recordation certificate for all does six months of age and older is required. ADGA stamped duplicate application dated less than 30 days prior to August 25, 2010, or registration/recordation certificate is accepted for does six months of age and younger only. **NO PHOTO COPIES** will be accepted. The document as specified above for each doe entered must be presented to the show official during check in for verification of document and entry information. A no-notice registration verification for any doe may be called for at any time.
12. **SANCTION:** This is an ADGA Sanctioned Show. (Junior Does and Senior Does are separately sanctioned.) **"ADGA" rules shall govern.**

13. **All tattoos** must be legible and the goat and registration papers must be available upon request to the Show Secretary or Chairman before and during judging.
14. **All livestock pens and stalls** are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily. Do not enter more goats than you can properly manage.
15. **All goats must be properly cared for and must be show fit** (clipped, clean, healthy and neatly displayed). The Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds or from display, any animal that may be deemed unsuitable for exhibition. See General Livestock Rule No. 27.
16. **SHOW ATTIRE:** Show whites are recommended. Strive for a professional appearance for our spectators. No cell phones in show ring.
HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: All goats must be properly dehorned, sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. All goats of any age must be identified with a Federal Scrapie Program identification number. Out-of-state goats must have a Certificate of Veterinary inspection dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair and an Import Number. A negative Brucellosis test is not necessary for **temporary** entry into the state for show purposes only. All goats are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds. Milk from lactating dairy goats will be discarded.
BASE DATES: Junior Does: Aug. 28, 2010/ Senior Does: Aug. 29, 2010
ONE DIVISION: Animals may not be shown in more than one Division. See General Rules. Animals in group classes must be shown in same division as their individual class.

Sables may enter as "Exhibit only", if space permits. See General Livestock Rules. Entry form must be marked "Exhibit Only". Does must be registered with ADGA.

All Champions and Reserve Champions will receive Rosettes.

Best Udder: (Classes 11-16 & 18) 1st-\$5 2nd-\$3

No exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.

JUNIOR DOE SHOW

Class:

1. Kids born in June, July and Aug. 2010
2. Kids born in May 2010
3. Kids born in April 2010
4. Kids born in March 2010
5. Kids born Jan. and Feb. 2010
6. Yearlings 8 months and under 24 months (not in milk)
7. JUNIOR GRAND CHAMPION OF BREED (from first/possibly second place winners of classes 1-6)
JUNIOR RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION OF BREED
8. Junior Get-of-Sire: 3 Junior Does, the Get-of-One-Sire. **Sire must be named on entry.** One Get-of-Sire per sire, per exhibitor. If two exhibitors combine goats for Get-of-Sire Classes, Premiums will be paid to the Exhibitor who listed entry on entry form.
- 9 Junior Produce-of-Dam: 2 Junior Does, the product of one Dam. **Dam must be named on entry.** May be owned by more than one exhibitor, but must be listed on only one exhibitor's entry form.
10. Breeder's Trio: To consist of 3 Does. All must be bred and owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.

BEST UDDERED- First & Second place udders will be selected by the Judge in Classes 11-16 and 18

11. Under two years in milk.
12. Two years and under three years, in milk.
13. Three years and under four years, in milk.
14. Four years and under five years, in milk.
15. Five years and under seven, in milk.
16. Seven years and over, in milk.
17. GRAND CHAMPION OF BREED (first place winners of classes 11-16)

RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION OF BREED

18. Champion Challenge (Permanent Champions plus Grand Champion of the day) Premiums plus BOB Rosette.
19. BEST UDDER OF BREED.....**Rosette.**
20. Get-of-Sire: To consist of 3 Does (two or more must be senior does), the Get-of-One-Sire. **Sire must be named on entry.**
One Get-of-Sire per sire, per exhibitor. If two exhibitors combine goats for Get-of-Sire Classes, Premiums will be paid to the Exhibitor who listed entry on entry form.
21. Produce-of-Dam: Two Does, one of which must be a Senior, from one Dam. **Dam must be named on entry.** May be owned by more than one exhibitor, but must be listed on only one exhibitor's entry form.
22. Dam and Daughter: Must be owned by one exhibitor.
23. Three Generation (Grand Dam, Dam and Daughter) All must be owned by exhibitor.
24. Best Three Females: One must be a Senior Doe. All must be bred and owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.
25. Dairy Herd: Four Does in milk. All owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.

ISDGA will award a special Barn Prize of \$75 to the Exhibitor in this Department with the best total herdsmanship, which includes cleanliness and presentation of goats, pens, aisles and decorations. **The Western Idaho Fair** will add \$25 to this amount. Daily rosettes will be awarded.
